Hotels

Payments

- If visiting Mexico from abroad, we recommend exchanging currencies before the trip. It is a good idea to get Mexican pesos before your arrival in the country.
- In Mexico it is possible to change money in banks or exchange houses. The airport offers reasonable exchange rates. You can withdraw Mexican pesos from ATMs with your credit or debit card. This is usually the most convenient way to access cash while traveling, it is safer than carrying cash and the exchange rate is usually quite competitive.
- It is important to note that credit and debit cards are not accepted in all establishments.

Transport

• There will be a special transportation that will take you from Mexico City to the city of Tlaxcala de Xicohténcatl. The departure will be on Tuesday, November 22 at 3:30 p.m. at the General Rectorate of the UAM, located in Prol. Canal de Miramontes 3855, Coapa, Tlalpan, 14387 Mexico City. Likewise, at the end of the congress, a return transportation from Mexico City will be offered, leaving on Saturday, November 25 at 2:00 p.m. from Parque Juárez located at Av. 20 de Noviembre 24, Centro, 90000 Centro, Tlaxcala de Xicohténcatl.

Taxis

- From Mexico City International Airport (AICM) you can take a taxi (hired from inside the airport) to the Radisson Paraíso Perisur or any hotel you are staying at. There are counters inside the airport, in the arrivals hall, where it is possible to pay for the trip in advance. The fare for trips is determined by the area you are traveling to.
- You can check if your UBER service works, it is usually cheaper than airport taxis and you only have to indicate the exit gate from where you can wait for the service.
- If you want to travel in Mexico City, we recommend requesting taxis from the hotel reception. We do not recommend using taxis on the street as they can represent a danger.



Phone

- It is important to check if you require an adapter for your cell phone, computer or any electronic device charger, since in Mexico the voltage is 110 volts at 60 Hz, type A and B. Find more information here: https://www.power-plugs-sockets.com/us/mexico/
- You can buy a SIM card from Telcel America at the airport. We also suggest the app Truphone which provides global data for international calls without changing your SIM card. More information here: https://www.truphone.com/consumer/

Food & Weather

- In Mexico, the tip is not included in the bill. If you want to tip for the service, it is a custom to add between 10% and 15% of the total bill.
- We do not recommend eating on the street since you can get sick, it is more advisable to eat in a restaurant.
- Do not drink tap water unless you are sure it has been filtered or purified. Bottled water is safer
- The weather in November in Tlaxcala is usually mild, with maximum temperatures of 24° C and nights that can drop to 6° C. We recommend carrying an umbrella and appropriate clothing.

IV. SIGHTSEEING TIPS IN MEXICO CITY

Tlaxcala Art Museum

It houses a collection of works by Frida Kahlo. Its temporary exhibitions show trends in Latin America and Mexico. It has 5 exhibition rooms, a library, an arts documentation center, a bookstore and a gift shop.

Museum of Memory of Tlaxcala

It depends on the state Historical Archive. It is located in a 17th century mansion that was the headquarters of the Holy Cross of Jerusalem brotherhood. It is made up of 5 permanent exhibition rooms and other spaces for temporary exhibitions.

Miguel N. Lira Museum

Its objective is to preserve and disseminate the literary work of this Tlaxcaltecan born in 1905. In its 7 exhibition rooms, there are personal objects and objects from his printing press, as well as books, magazines and texts that give an account of his prolific production. It has interactive systems for visitors as well as audiovisual means to bring information closer.

Tlaxcala Regional Museum

It exhibits 200 pieces including paleontological bone remains, ceramics, stone sculpture, obsidian knives, snails, paintings, sculptures, books, furniture, documents and photographs. In addition to recently discovered objects, such as the archaeological remains found in Quimicho and some pieces of majolica from the 16th and 17th centuries.

Living Museum of Popular Arts and Traditions of Tlaxcala
